

ACTIVITY REPORTS

ASIAN VOLUNTEERS VOICE IN JUNE AND JULY

June 20th Asian Volunteers Voice (AVV) was Facilitated by Richa (Me) and Kai. He presented about"South East Asia & Beyond (SEAB)" volunteer program. There were 17 guest listener including Sophat and facilitators.

Sophat presented about The South East Asia & Beyond (SEAB) Volunteer Program that is a newly established, year-long initiative by the Cambodian Youth Action (CYA) organization. This pilot program aims to address the social, environmental, and economic challenges in Southeast Asia by promoting volunteer exchanges, fostering intercultural learning, and building the capacity of youth in the region. The program is set to run from May 2024 to April 2025, with a fixed period of 12 months.

The SEAB program is a significant opportunity for youth in Southeast Asia and beyond to contribute to community development, gain valuable experience, and foster intercultural understanding. Only six places are available, making early application essential.

The AVV event, held **on July 18th,** successfully brought together 27 registered participants from 13 different countries, including staff from ALLIANCE members and SCI branches.

Following the opening, Alex from DALAA Thailand took the stage to present the Koh Sukorn workcamp. Alex provided a comprehensive overview of the project, which focuses on preserving local agriculture, particularly rice planting, on the island of Koh Sukorn. He emphasized the importance of this workcamp in helping to maintain traditional agricultural practices while fostering a sense of community among volunteers and locals.

Organizations across Asia and Europe are encouraged to promote this program among their youth networks. The SEAB program is a unique chance to engage in meaningful volunteer work while developing leadership skills and making a lasting impact on local communities. Overall, the AVV had good number of participation and bilateral communication.

Next, Siva from MOVE Malaysia presented on three distinct workcamps: YCK, MAB, and Golden Age. Each of these workcamps serves a different segment of the community. Siva's presentation underscored the impact these workcamps have on both the volunteers and the local communities, illustrating how volunteer efforts can create lasting positive change.

The event also featured a volunteer story-sharing session, where Ayaka, Takuya, and Kai recounted their experiences in Thailand and Malaysia.

Overall, the AVV event was a success, achieving its goals of fostering global connections and promoting volunteerism as a powerful tool for positive change.

VOLTRA, HONGKONG

>>> HONG KONG SOCIAL INNOVATION AND DEVELOPMENT CAMP

During July, VolTra and Empact co-hosted the impactful "Hong Kong Social Innovation and Development Camp." Twenty-nine mainland students participated, gaining unique insights into Hong Kong's diverse society.

A significant part of the camp involved visiting Sham Shui Po, where the students explored subdivided flats and met former homeless individuals. These experiences provided a stark contrast to Hong Kong's prosperity, fostering empathy and a deeper understanding of the city's social challenges.

Additionally, the students engaged in food distribution activities, witnessing the importance of community support and the positive impact of social initiatives. This hands-on involvement emphasized the role of charity and social responsibility in addressing societal needs.

>>> GIED, PHILIPPINES

In honor of our volunteers worldwide this International Volunteer Day 2023, Global Initiative for Exchange and Development Inc. -GIED in partnership with the Local Government of Alegria, Cebu organized our 2nd IVD Christmas BOOTCAMP with our long term foreign volunteers last 12-15 December in Alegria, Cebu, Philippines In the mountain village of Compostela, Alegria our volunteers did a river clean-up in one of the jump-off canyonnering sites, planted bamboo trees in the nearby BADAM Water Shed protected area and sorted out garbage in their MRF facility.

>>> GLOBAL VOLUNTARY SERVICE TO STOP CLIMATE CHANGE (SCC) 2024

To dramatically increase the impact for carbon reduction as well as strengthen volunteerism and management of NGOs, we started the SCC project, with sponsorship of the UPS Foundation, NLAPO and Mitsubishi UFJ Foundation. After the great success in 2016, we have been continuing and developing the SCC project mainly by our selfefforts (besides grant from NLAPO and Fund of NICE) and collaboration since it is huge work and takes some time to get real impact.

Due to the COVID-19, it was stopped since 2020, but now revised in a new format from 2024! India, Indonesia, Japan, and Cambodia are participating in the SCC. Unfortunately, due to the low number of volunteers, only Japan (NICE) will have project this year, but it will be held in Japan for 46 days from Nov. 10th to Dec. 25th. Short-term workcamps are also scheduled during the period. Let's look forward to it!
